The wheel portrays the cycle of Creation, Preservation and Release. The symbol stands for continuity as well as change. It implies that NSS continuously strives for social change and harmony.

- * The program aims to implement the idea of social welfare and provide service to the society without any biasness.
- * The NSS volunteers work for the needy to enhance their standard of living.
- * The volunteers try and learn to utilise the resources that are available to the maximum and provide facilities even with scarce resources.
- * NSS reach out to people during natural and man-made disasters by providing food, clothing, first -aid and other necessary items to the victims.
